
and activities. They then moved on to the theme of Gardaí. In the roleplay zone they explored lots of garda equipment, solved some crimes and






February, a short but by no means quiet month for 2nd Class. They started the month off with a bang learning all about the different celebrations around the world at this time of year. They had lots of

4th Class enjoyed the short month of February with the midterm break in between. They covered a range of different topics across the curriculum and took a lot from each of them.

Multiplication and division was our focus in maths this month, looking at long multiplication in particular. In English, they looked at informative writing and reading comprehension, learning about the Amazon rainforest as a case study as well as a range of different countries and animals looking at their facts and figures.



In SESE, forestry was our theme this month, looking at how forests have changed historically in Ireland and the wider world, and how important they are to our lives and the contribution to a healthy biodiverse landscape. They linked this to their art work, drawing forests and campsites.



In PE, they played handball in small teams, while also taking part in the school cross country and soccer outings. It's great to see the children so involved and eager to take part. In music, they explored more traditional Irish songs both as Gaeilge and through English. They enjoyed looking at the songs being performed live and the range of trad instruments being used such as the bodhrán, banjo, violin and the tin whistle. To complete the month, 4th class were helping with the bake sale for our cosy Friday and

loved getting to wear their cosy clothes into school.

5th Class worked really hard this month. They learned about the force of friction in science, and made their own zip lines. In English, they practised using the figurative language technique of onomatopoeia, and made onomatopoeic Pop Art in the style of Roy Lichtenstein. During the

course of January and February, the children did a lot of research on Italy, The Renaissance, and Ancient Rome. They worked together in groups to create projects on these topics, and the results were excellent. Before midterm break, 5th class brightened up their corridor and classroom with some lovely heart art for Valentine's

Day.















This month 6th Class have been making great progress with their class novel 'The Guns of Easter' which has linked in with the theme of World War 1 in history. They further explored the theme through poetry and song. The class read Wilfred Owen's poem 'Dulce et Decorum est' and sang 'The Green Fields of France' giving them a great insight into the the harsh realities of WW1. In art, they painted and glossed their clay clock creations and have begun some lovely cross stitch pieces.



They made excellent progress with their running practice and Ms. Hoffman was delighted to have some pupils run their first Malahide Junior Parkrun last Sunday. There are some very talented athletes in the class, with Alex Wallace being first finisher on the morning! All the training should put us in good stead for the upcoming schools' cross country event.

The pupils showed great organisational skills and group work whilst putting the finishing touches to their projects on cities of the world. They're looking forward to presenting them to the class this week.




February Anti - Bullying Topic
