

### Around The Classes

**Junior Infants** have had a super November. The first theme of the month in Play and Learn was the construction site. They played with construction vehicles and blocks in sand, built

houses with blocks and junk art, investigated force by making ramps for vehicles and made patchwork houses with fabric and fibre. They then moved

on to the theme of polar regions. They learned about the Arctic and the Antarctic and about the animals that live in these polar regions. The children played with polar animals in small world, made beautiful bear



silhouette paintings, used chalk to create colourful Northern Lights scenes and made their own penguins. They sorted solid

and liquid objects and investigated the effect heat has on solids by heating chocolate, butter and ice-cream and using straws to blow holes in ice cubes. In Irish they learned all about bia. They sang lots of songs, played fun games and



learned lots of new words and phrases. They love telling each other what they have in their bosca lóin each day. In maths they learned all about measurement and investigated texture, exploring things that were rough and smooth. They started learning their Jolly Phonics sounds this month and are loving singing the songs and doing the actions for each sound. They have worked and played so well again this month and should be very proud of themselves!

Senior Infants have had a busy November. In Play and Learn this month we have learned all about 'Space'. They worked together on a collaborative art project which

featured all the planets, astronauts and even the international space station!

They learned lots of things about our solar system and the children really enjoyed it. They built some amazing rockets in construction too. In maths, they were learning about 2D shapes and went on a hunt in their classroom to find some real-life examples. Senior Infants baked some lovely treats for our cake sale last Friday. The class had a visit from Mouse

from Owls and the children built huts for squirrels to hibernate in and tested which ones would keep the squirrel the warmest!








November in 1st Class has flown by! The children have been busy

3<sup>rd</sup> Class have been very busy for the month of November. They have been learning all about coastal seas and the negative effects water pollution can have on them. The children are



currently researching facts about sea creatures to create an informational report to share to the class. With the help of David Attenborough, they gained a deeper insight into the various sea creatures that live within our coastal seas. The children have also been engaging in the STEPS engineering projects since the beginning of September. With the closing date fast approaching, everyone has been working exceptionally hard to finalise their drawings of

their inventions. They were lucky to have two engineers visit the class last week to provide some expert advice to us all. They are really excited to start building their



ideas in the coming days. It will be a tough competition as all of the ideas are really fantastic! With Christmas just around the corner, they will begin to unwrap their books from their "Bookvent Calender". The class will be unwrapping a book every day and reading it together in class to mark the countdown to Christmas. In SPHE, the children created "gratitude mugs" expressing all of the things that they are grateful for. This

was a special activity that highlighted the importance of giving thanks to the people who care for us in our lives. Third Class have worked really hard this month and are looking forward to more fun activities in December.



4th Class enjoyed a lovely month in November, taking on plenty of new challenges and trying new skills across the curriculum. 
