All that, on top of the wonderful work they're doing with sounds, maths and Gaeilge made for a busy and fun filled month!









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5th Class has been very busy this month. They have enjoyed lots of P.E. activities including G.A.A, rugby, athletics and Daly exercise. In English they have been working hard in stations each day. They are really getting stuck into 'Wonder', by R.J. Palacio. Looking through different characters' eyes has been really interesting. It's so important to consider every point of view in a story. In maths they have completed big units of work on data, problem solving and long division. It's going really well and Mrs. Halpin is very proud of all their hard work. In Gaeilge they finished off a unit on 'Scoil' and have been working hard on 'Bia' for the rest of the month. They always end up 'stiúgtha leis an ocras' if Gaeilge is before break! The theme for S.E.S.E. this month was 'forces that changed the world'. In history they learned about the Bronze Age and the history of energy and power. The invention of the wheel was so important! In geography they learned about our earth's resources, how we extract fossil fuels from our earth and all about more renewable energy options. In science they learned all about friction. They had lots of fun using their knowledge of air resistance to create parachutes. They also did a unit on

naturalist Sir David Attenborough, learning all about his life and how he ended up so passionate about conservation. Across the arts 5<sup>th</sup>Class have been busy creating lots of colourful pieces. They created optical illusion

paper waves, one-point perspective art and beautiful zentangle pieces with a splash of colour for Mrs. Halpin's birthday. They've been learning about making sounds and all the ways they can make different sounds without ever using a conventional instrument. They have also been working really hard on preparing for their St. Andrew's Day assembly in the church on the 2<sup>nd</sup>December. It's been lots of practising, learning lines, singing songs and saying prayers.







6th Class have had an action-packed month full of fun activities and great learning! The class have started their first batch of English stations and have enjoyed listening to a Macbeth audiobook, reading their class novel 'Benny & Omar' and exploring the concepts of onomatopoeia, procedural & persuasive writing! In maths they have been focusing on the topics of fractions and decimals. They can't wait to test out their designs in the coming days! This month the class have also been very interested in the FIFA World Cup and this has been the centre of some very interesting conversations and activities. The class created very interesting tourist brochures for each of the participating countries and have also designed some very imaginative football kits! In PE the class have been very busy participating in yoga, rugby, hockey with Mr Jones, Daly Exercise and even got the opportunity to take part in another orienteering event which took place in Corkagh Park. Luckily the weather was kinder to us this time and the class had a fantastic time strengthening their map work and teamwork skills!
