



In maths the topics of division, 2D shapes and number theory have all been completed. The class made Christmas pictures out of 2D shapes! The children are also becoming long division



experts! In Gaeilge they finished off a unit on Bia, as well as An Geimhreadh (which was very appropriate with the weather)! and An Nollaig to finish off the month in festive style!

This month's theme in S.E.S.E was two-fold. The first theme was 'Italy'. They learned all about the country Italy in geography and the historical period of the Renaissance. They also had a look at the theme 'revolutions' and learned all about the American and French revolutions and the Irish rebellion. Across the arts they've completed lots of lovely work this month. They've been practising their carols for the Christmas carol concert at the end of the month. In art they created 'Elfies' and lovely Santa paintings. They also made salt dough and created Christmas decorations.







Although December has been quite a short month, 6th Class have been very busy putting in a great effort in many different activities. In English the class have continued stations. Some of the activities included researching, planning and writing a set of instructions of how to get to the World Cup Final in Qatar as well as writing reports on the life cycle of Arctic animals. They also continued their work on Macbeth and the class novel "Benny & Omar" which they are enjoying a lot! In Irish they have been doing lots of revision of verbs. They have also been participating in listening tasks and having some great discussions as Gaeilge about Christmas and winter to improve their understanding and fluency of the language! Mr. Jones has been very impressed seeing the great effort the class have put in to speak more as Gaeilge! They have recently begun looking at the concept of sustainability and the class have been tasked with creating presentation outlining a new sustainable St. Andrew's using the Canva website. They will



be focusing on criteria such as energy, waste, biodiversity and transport to try and make their "new school" as sustainable and environmentally friendly as possible. The class also continued their study of Fair Trade and even participated in a Fair Trade chocolate tasting! The class really enjoyed (most) of the chocolate and couldn't believe how affordable it was. They are determined to try and make better decisions when buying treats so that they can help Fair Trade farmers around the world.

Finally, to spread the Christmas spirit around the school 6thClass helped decorate the school Christmas Trees! They were also invited to perform a short Christmas concert for the residents of Talbot Lodge Nursing Home which was a fantastic experience for us all!
