#### Around The Classes

Junior Infants have made a great start to the new year! They learned lots about dinosaurs through story, art and play. They created amazing carnivore and herbivore dinosaur worlds, dug for ancient treasure in the sand pit and made junk art dinosaurs from egg boxes. Ms. Teeling Malone has joined us for teaching practice this month and the children have had a wonderful time being creative through the themes of 'The 3 Little Pigs' and 'The Farm'. The boys and girls re-created the story of the 3 little pigs in small world and made pig masks. They learned all about what things are made from - different



materials and made the 3 pigs houses of straw, wood and bricks! They worked in role in the farm shop, taking orders and selling meat, vegetables and bread fresh from the farm! They

constructed beautiful farms for the happy farm animals and played games like farm dominoes and bingo! In science, they explored the water tray and learned about

floating and sinking, then transformed it into a lovely farm pond for some happy frogs!


3rdClass have been very busy for the month of January. They celebrated the start of the new year together by creating "2023 party hats". They then had to think of 3 goals that they

They are looking forward to seeing how they get on over the year. 3rd Class have also had the opportunity to learn about Fairtrade. With the support of websites such as Fairtrade Ireland and Oxfam, they were able to investigate the reasons why some cocoa farmers are being unfairly treated. Fairtrade has helped to make cocoa farming in places like Cote d'Ivoire and Ghana more sustainable so that farmers can better provide for themselves and their communities. With chocolate on all of their minds, they drew some of their favourite brands. Using markers and colouring pencils, the children produced some wonderful pieces of work. They also had the



As part of their oral language tasks, the children had great fun sharing with each other what they did over the Christmas holidays with lovely descriptive detail. In English, the children have started station activities in which they undertake five different activities throughout the course of the week. The children have been learning comprehension skills such as predicting and questioning. The children are also in the process of learning about narrative writing and are very eager to write the first drafts of their stories. In maths, the children focused on symmetry at the start of the month. The class created delightful symmetrical butterflies in which they created identical patterns on the wings of the butterflies. classroom for us to view daily. Lastly, in art, the children have continued working on optical illusions as well as learning about the Chinese New Year. 

In history they learned about Ireland as the 'Land of Saints and Scholars' and examined monastic life and the importance of monasteries in Early Christian Ireland. They all agreed that handwriting every book that people needed must have been tiring work! In geography and science, they have been learning all about the Burren, its ecosystem, its unique karst landscape and the interdependence of all the flora and fauna in



the area. They have been busy working on their Stay Safe Program in S.P.H.E. and learning all about feeling safe and keeping themselves safe. They've started the ball rolling on their Junior Entrepreneur Project for this year and are really looking forward to sharing their great ideas and picking one to create a business out of. Across the arts they have worked on very funny scripts from 'Who's Your Mummy?' in Drama. They have created lovely artworks based around 'A hot cuppa', using nature to create their names and some Magic Flashlight Art.
