In My Shoes Collection



The following awards went to players in challenges against yours truly and were based on the quality of their performance


Best game awards went to: - Joshua Brewer; Peter O'Sullivan; Michael Shihoff;

With the summer break almost upon us, we are looking forward to our school tour, outdoor games and more fun in the sunshine.





4th Class have had a very busy May! This month the children took part in Active Week which gave the children the opportunity to take part in a range of different activities including soccer, cricket, athletics, tennis, dance and

many more! The class had great fun throughout the week and demonstrated their excellent teamwork skills. Following on from this, the children have been working very hard in maths as they focused on the topic of time. The class practised adding and subtracting hours and minutes in which they discovered key steps have to be followed in order to arrive at the correct answer. The class have also been

May has been a busy and productive month in 5th Class. They have had lots of fun activities and learned plenty in between times! They have done a huge amount of work on their Junior Entrepreneur Project 'Beaded Beasts'. It was a great experience and they all learned a lot about the highs and lows

of running a business. Their final decision will be how to spend their profits. Thanks to all the classes and parents for their support! They've had some great P.E. this past month too. They really enjoyed Active Week and all the fun activities each day. Between cricket, GAA and athletics as well, it's been a very active month! Well done to all our class members who took part

in Santry this month as well. The class has done lots of great work in class across the curriculum. They finished their second class novel, Goodnight Mr. Tom, which they all really enjoyed. In Gaeilge they completed a unit on Teilifís and have started into Siopadóireacht. Maths included work on 3D shapes, number sentences, data, weight and capacity. In S.E.S.E. they worked on topics including modern day famine, keeping our bodies healthy and teeth. They've also been learning all about Islam in religion. Their artwork this month has been super! They've drawn silly chalk emus, learned about Pop Art, made Piet Mondrian inspired pieces, 3D balloon art and some floral inspired still life drawing for the Parish Hall. Roll on summer fun in June!

May has been an action-packed month for 6th Class! The class have worked so hard on their Junior Entrepreneur Project this month and are very proud of their product "Sports Skill Cards". These are aimed at teaching children the correct technique for skills linked to some of the most popular sports including football, rugby and basketball. They are currently on sale in packs of 6 cards that also include QR codes that link to videos that can be watched! 6th Class also worked brilliantly during

their study of World War 1 and 2! The groups were each given a country to research that was involved in both wars and the class created magnificent group projects highlighting the similarities and differences between the two global events! In maths we have explored the concepts of the circle and 3D shapes. We were able to solve problems involving the circumference and area of a circle while we also figured out how to correctly identify 3D shapes and find the volume and surface area of 3D shapes. We also created some really cool 3D art to finish our work on 3D shapes! This month 6th



class also completed their "Tech Talk" series with PWC. Our final session focused on "Technology for Toys" and it stimulated a great discussion related to how toys have changed from when our parents were young to now! The class also designed their own unique toy of the future and described how technology will continue to have a massive impact for years to come! Finally, 6th Class have begun rehearsals for our end of year school play "We're all going on a ... Summer Holiday"! We have a couple of busy weeks ahead to get the practice in but we are very much looking forward to putting on a fantastic show in June!
