Around the Classes

Junior Infants have had a fun-filled February. The first theme they explored in play and learn was dinosaurs. They played with dinosaurs in small world and did role-play in the dinosaur museum. They learned about the life cycle of the butterfly and the children helped make butterflies for our class display. The children did some beautiful writing about their midterm and have been learning about the 'bossy R' in phonics. They have been learning about the



number 9 and how to make and show nine in different ways. In science, the class completed a STEM challenge, making a structure to balance baby bear out of spaghetti and marshmallows. It was lots of fun! They had a lovely Valentine's Day, the class made cards for people they love and everyone was excited to help to bake for the Cake Sale. They are looking forward to another great month ahead!



4th Class enjoyed the short month of February with plenty of new activities and topics being explored. During the month of February they also had 'internet safety day' where they brushed up on their skills of how to be safe online while using the internet. They got a great grasp of how important using the internet properly is and how it's all around us in today's world whether that be for helping with homework or texting/playing with friends online. The class created lovely wallpaper screens on the day as well to hang up in the classroom. To conclude the month, the children created lovely art pieces for St Valentine's Day making cards for family members and drawings of teddy bears as well.


