#### Around the Classes



It has been a bright and creative month in **Junior Infants** as the children have sprung into spring! The first play and learn theme of the month was the farm. They set up a farm shop selling fresh farm produce, put together a farm in small world, created a farm in a cutting and sticking activity, played farm lotto and made beautiful sheep and hens in art.



Seachtain na Gaeilge was a fun and busy couple of weeks. Play and learn was done through Irish with the theme An Fherim. They read lots of Irish stories and sang lots of Irish songs. They really enjoyed their first school performance for the ceolchoirm and they did a fantastic job! Local musicians Louis, Eilís, Margaret and Don came in to demonstrate some of their instruments and play traditional Irish

music for the children. Bhí an spraoi

agus craic acu go léir! Their next play and learn theme was 'The Garden Shop'. They had role-play in the garden shop, created spring gardens with loose parts and play dough, painted flowers and created beautiful 3D flower art. In maths, they had great fun using the balance scales to explore weight and have been doing lots of addition activities.



Senior Infants had a lovely March. The children did lots to celebrate Seachtain na Gaeilge and Senior Infants gave a super performance at our ceolchoirm in the church. The children made such an effort speaking as Gaeilge and won lots of raffle tickets in the classroom for doing so! The children loved their visit from a traditional Irish music band (led by Ms. Fisher's parents!). They also celebrated World Book Day. The children enjoyed reading buddies with 5<sup>th</sup> class where they chatted about their excellent costumes, their favourite books and the older children read to them. They had an exciting visit from Mouse from OWLS, who brought the children outside to learn about how birds

build their nests. Senior Infants have been working really hard on their practice for their show 'Jack and the Beanstalk', which they are really excited to perform for an audience! They did the themes of mini beasts and dinosaurs in play and learn and engaged in some amazing imaginative small world play, and made some great junk art and constructions.











This month 1<sup>st</sup> Class turned their attention to their new topic of 'places'. The class learnt how to look at an atlas, and learnt the names of the seven continents and five oceans with some very catchy songs! They organised their writers workshop and have started learning how to create their very own storybooks. learning all about Persophene, the Greek Goddess of Spring. Staying on the theme of myths and legends they delved into the Irish legend Tir na nÓg. In science they have been learning all about the lifecycle of a frog and even had a chance to taste swamp juice, YUCK! They were so lucky to have Ms.Dodds

with them this month. The children loved having her and wish her the very best of luck as she is coming very close to completing her teacher training. It's been a busy month and the class have been working so hard. 2<sup>nd</sup> class are so excited for what lies ahead next month!



3rd Class have had a very busy but enjoyable March full of fantastic learning! In English they have been working on producing their very own newspaper reports focusing on new forms of transport. They learnt about the structure of the reports, the importance of a headline and how to incorporate direct and indirect speech into their work. The class are really proud of what they produced! Their next task is creating an amazing setting description about





a trip to a tropical island to continue their focus on transport and movement! They also finished their class novel "The Butterfly Lion" and created some very in-depth book reviews on it! To add to this,  $3^{rd}$  class have also been learning about some very famous modes of transport from the past. After creating timelines identifying how different forms of transport have developed over time, they created pair projects to highlight the similarities and differences between them. In maths the class learnt about the concept of division and used their new skills to solve a range of word and number-based problems! Everyone has put in a brilliant effort to learn their tables





and have really enjoyed the weekly competitions! They have just begun their next topic of time and are learning how to read and use timetables and calendars. 4th Class had plenty of activities on for the month of March with Seachtain na Gaeilge at the forefront of our studies as well as the celebrations of St. Patrick's Day. For Seachtain na Gaeilge the children focused on speaking as much Gaeilge as they could in class and around the school showcasing their new and improving vocabulary. They also performed 2 amhráin gaeilge in the church for the ceolchoirm singing 'Beidh Aonach Amárach' and 'Peigín Leitir Mór'. In maths, they continued with their studies of long multiplication, as well as looking at length, learning how to convert different metric measurements such as centimetres, metres and kilometres.



In SESE, St. Patrick was the focus for the month of March studying the history of his time in Ireland and also his move here from Wales.  $4^{th}$  class also looked at forestry in Ireland and deforestation with a particular focus on the Amazon rainforest in Brazil. In SPHE, the anti-bullying topic was 'peer



pressure' and ways in which the children can recognise peer pressure and how best to respond to it. In art, flowers, plants, trees and all things spring were on their minds, drawing lovely pictures of daffodils and forests. As a celebration of St. Patrick's Day, we had our lá glas in school with the children dressing up in all their favourite éadaí glas. There was also a traditional band who came in to showcase all the amazing instruments that we use in Irish music. In P.E,  $4^{th}$  class have continued their swimming lessons in the PSLC and are improving really well while also competing in the cross country athletics races in Santry this month. It was a great experience for all the participants to race and compete against other schools.

5th Class did lots of fun things in March. The children took part in lots of activities to celebrate World Book Day. The children took part in an online guiz, read books to Junior Infants, and did an in class book tasting. The children learned the Irish songs 'Trasna na dTonnta' and 'Scaoil Uait na Deora'. They performed them excellently at the school ceolchoirm. 5<sup>th</sup> class finished their architecture projects this month and will be presenting them to the class over the next couple of weeks. A small group of the class took part in a lego day while the rest of the children went to do cross-country running. They came up with





